Thank you so much for hiring Steady the Wheel to perform at your event! Steady the Wheel is a five-piece cover band based out of Airdrie, Alberta. We're a small city band with big city sound! We are at our best playing small to midsized events, performing a selection of popular classic and contemporary rock songs that appeal to a wide variety of people of all ages. We've played everything from private parties to outdoor festivals and are especially looking forward to supporting your event!

Included in this package you're holding is some technical information, a stage plot, and just some general information you'll need to know to make your night (or day) with Steady the Wheel one to remember!

What we will bring:

- 1. ALL the music and audio gear required for the show. No need to rent or pay for any additional equipment. We are completely outfitted and use only professional grade gear.**
- 2. Up to three full sets of LIVE popular and contemporary / classic rock music for your guests to enjoy and dance to.**
- 3. We employ the services of a Sound Technician to independently operate our sound equipment for the show. Having a Sound Technician on site for the performance elevates the quality of sound to the highest degree possible for the venue, and significantly enhances the overall experience for all of your guests.**

What we need from you:

1. A stage or designated performance area clear of obstructions and large enough to comfortably accommodate the five of us, including all of our gear. The minimum required space is 16' wide by 12' deep (see attached stage plot). The performance area should also be configured to be as distinct as possible from any heavy traffic or guest areas to ensure everyone's comfort and security.

2. Plenty of "clean" power to operate our equipment (see stage plot). By "clean", we mean electrical circuits that aren't being otherwise used to run large facility systems such as HVAC or institutional grade lighting systems. These systems have a very negative effect on sound quality and also have the potential to damage our equipment through spikes and surges.

3. At least 3 but preferably 4 hours of semi-private and uninterrupted time to load-in, setup, and sound check.

4. Some bottled water and maybe a light snack would be greatly appreciated if not too difficult to arrange.

5. Lots of people who love to dance and enjoy a variety of music!
